Requests for Carbaglu (carglumic acid) may be approved for the following:

- I. Individual has a diagnosis of *acute* hyperammonemia due to the deficiency of the hepatic enzyme N-acetylglutamate synthase (NAGS); **AND**
- II. Using as adjunctive therapy with other ammonia lowering therapies, including but not limited to the following:
 - A. Alternate pathway medications to eliminate nitrogen waste (such as, sodium phenylacetate); **OR**
 - B. Hemodialysis; **OR**
 - C. Dietary protein restriction;

OR

- III. Individual has a diagnosis of *chronic* hyperammonemia due to the deficiency of the hepatic enzyme NAGS; **AND**
- IV. Using as maintenance therapy.
