## **Building Knowledge and Practice**

The Wisconsin Opioid Project ECHO® has three steps.

1. Share best practices to reduce disparities.
2. Apply case-based learning to master complexity.
3. Evaluate and monitor outcomes.

## **Join Our Learning Loop**

*Free videoconferences are held the third Friday of every month from 12:30-1:30 p.m.* These sessions link interdisciplinary specialist teams with community providers. Each session has a topic. There is time for a collaborative discussion on submitted patient cases. This virtual knowledge-sharing network creates a learning loop:

- Community providers learn from specialists.
- Community providers learn from each other.
- Specialists learn from community providers as best practices emerge.
